Strumming rhythm for each chord:
 This also sounds good with just 6 down strums,
 and no up strum.
 You could do both: without it on the first chord,
 and with it on the second chord,
 and so on.

After you have finished any repeats you might play,
 finish with a **A** chord, with a single down strum.

The **Bm** chord is tricky, but keep trying to do it even if it sounds horrible! You'll get there.
 You do need to learn barre chords like this to play some songs, but at least it's much easier than on guitar.
